#### **PURCHASING STUDENT BOOK PACKS:**

In 2025 we will continue to use 'Melbourne Office Supplies' for parents to purchase their child's school book packs online.

This simplifies the process for you and ensures that all children bring to school consistent supplies and requisites. We have developed a specific 'Donvale PS parent portal' for you to be able to purchase your child's 2025 book pack. The portal will display the year level's booklist and the requirements for the children in these year levels. These booklists have been developed by our class teachers.

Orders must be placed by the 23rd December 2024 to ensure delivery is on time, ready for collection from the school. Prep – Grade 2 will be supplied in bulk and be distributed to students as required. Grades 3-6 will be supplied in individual packs.

### To order your book packs:

- 2. Select the year level required for order
- 3. Please ensure that the students' name, your name and contact details are given and correct
- 4. Select 'Add to Cart'
- 5. If purchasing more than one booklist, please select 'Continue Shopping' and follow the same procedure from step 3
- 6. Headsets are compulsory for all students. Please add a headset to your order if you child does not already one.
- 7. Your order subtotal will display on screen
- 8. Select 'Proceed to checkout'
- 9. Enter your email address and continue
- 10. Enter your billing details and continue
- 11. Please choose your check-out option Credit/Debit available. Ensure payment details are correctly entered
- 12. You will receive a payment receipt, and an order confirmation to the email address you provided
- 13. Your child's pack/s will be delivered to the school

Should you choose to purchase your child's school requisites from another third party, we ask that you please purchase items that are the same or similar to that listed on your child's booklist. We can assure you that we have made every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents. We have spent considerable time selecting the most appropriate requisites to the meet the needs of our students.

All Prep — Grade 2 book packs will be delivered to the school in bulk in mid-January and will be distributed to the students by their classroom teacher as required.

## **FREE INSTRUCTION**

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

## **PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS**

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



#### **Curriculum Contributions**

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

# Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

# Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



## FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



## **SCHOOL PROCESSES**

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
